Riwaayat was divided into 2 rounds, first an online prelims rounds and second and the final exhibition rounds at Mini Oat, Delhi Technological University. In the preliminary round more than 50 Art societies from colleges throughout the country registered. These societies submit their artworks in drive link while registering for the prelims and later these artworks our judged by our team and hence, 20 best societies were shortlisted and were called upon stage for the second round.
